
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### THE SUNSHINE PROJECT

During the Spring of 2021, Far Away Friends had the opportunity to share our vision for improving access to equitable education for children across rural Uganda with our friends at Wordfence, a Seattle-based cybersecurity firm. In partnership, the Wordfence team helped us source local solar engineers in Uganda and funded the installation of a campus-wide solar system which is now providing power to all of our classrooms, dorms & teacher's housing!







### 264 AfriPad Kits Delivered

## Ending period poverty across our partner schools network in Amolatar



In Q2 of 2021, our Ugandan team was able to host our annual Mentorship, Menstrual Hygiene & Empowerment Training, reaching 264 girls at our partner schools across Namasale. This annual workshop brings girls together to call out the struggles faced by young women in rural communities and provide real-world tools to address them, including the distribution of menstrual hygiene kits from our friends at AfriPads.

To lead this workshop, we had the privilege of bringing Rachael Okuja to our partner schools as a special guest speaker. Having grown up in Amolatar herself, Rachael -- a Community Engagement & Training expert -- deeply understands the struggles faced by girls in rural Uganda. During her time in Namasale, Rachael spoke to girls from Global Leaders Primary and Agwinigiri Girls School about a range of topics from sexual health & consent, managing your period while in school and having the confidence to chase your biggest dreams. We are so proud to have had the opportunity to work with her as a mentor and visionary for young women in Amolatar District who can see themselves represented in strong women like Rachael and Collines!

This workshop & sanitary pad distribution was made possible by the efforts of the Rancho Bernardo High School Far Away Friends Club (@farawayfriendsrbhs) in collaboration with That's On Period (@thatsonperiodpusd) -- who, in their LAST MONTH of school, raised over \$1,000 to ensure 100 girls in our school networks wouldn't miss a day of school due to her period!
















## Social Enterprise: Breaking ground on the "Global Millers Maize Mill"

In the summer of 2021, our community came together once again for our annual 5k fundraiser (sponsored in part by Jordan Stearns & The Young Living Foundation) to fuel the construction of a maize mill in Amolatar. The impact of this project will be two-fold: first, it keeps local dollars in local hands by allowing merchants and farmers to grind their maize in the community, rather than paying to do so in a nearby city. Second, this will serve as an income generating project for Global Leaders Primary School and Far Away Friends Uganda, bringing us one step closer to long-term sustainability.


## FINANCIAL OVERVIEW
